

CONDUCT AND DISCIPLINE

GENERAL RULES

1. Strict discipline must be maintained within the school premises.
2. All students are expected to be courteous at all times. They should respect all staff members and their fellow students. Use of foul language will be strictly dealt with.
3. Unruly behaviour towards peers should be avoided.
4. Students should not be found shouting and shrieking in the corridors.
5. Students must not litter the school premises.
6. Respect for all school property has to be observed at all times. Damage to school property must be reported to the class teacher or the Principal. Any damage so caused will be recovered in full from the child/children concerned.
7. All students from Nursery to Class XII must buy and maintain the school diary.
8. Students must bring their diaries daily along with their text books, exercise books and stationery .
9. No books, magazines or papers other than textbooks or school library books may be brought to the school without the permission of the Principal.
10. The textbooks and exercise books must be covered with brown paper.
11. Students must come to school in the prescribed school uniform. On PTM days, they should accompany their parents in proper attire.
12. **Playing Holi or bursting crackers within the school premises and school buses is prohibited. Defaulters will be strictly dealt with.**
13. Students and Parents should not bring visitors to school without the prior permission of the Principal.
14. Students are not allowed to use the school telephone without the permission of the Principal.
15. No student is permitted to keep a mobile telephone, walkman, discman, iPod or any kind of playing cards with him/her during school hours. If a student is found carrying any of these or using them during school hours, they shall be confiscated immediately.
16. Parents are required to inform the school of any change of address or telephone number.
17. Elaborate birthday celebrations are not allowed in school.
18. Parents of the Nursery, Pre-Nursery and Prep children must write the names of their wards on their belongings, with a permanent marker. They should also send an extra set of clothes in their school bags to be used in case of emergency.

19. Students will have their refreshment in the break-time only. Every student must carry a tiffin-box, a table-mat, a clean napkin and a handkerchief every day.
20. All students must remain in the school premises during school hours. They are not allowed to roam in the corridors or around in the school premises. No student will leave his/her class without the permission of the teacher concerned. Truancy from class will entail punishment.
21. Students' cycles must be locked and parked at the cycle stand.
22. Students are not allowed to drive scooters/mopeds/cars while commuting to and from the school.
23. The school reserves the right to dismiss a student whose conduct is unbecoming and unsuitable to the school. Immorality, grave insubordination, contempt of authority or willful damage to property can lead to suspension/expulsion from the school. **A system of warning cards will be followed for the above mentioned misconduct. A student will be suspended/expelled on issue of the third warning card.**

RULES RELATED TO PUNCTUALITY AND ATTENDANCE:

1. Students must report to school on time.
2. Students are not allowed to go home once they come to school in the morning. Parents must not send their wards to school if they have an outside appointment during school hours.
3. Students who are escorted to and from school are not to leave before the escort arrives. The escort must have due authority in writing from the parents. In case of delay, they should inform the school office.
4. Students will not be allowed to attend school, if late. The late-comers will have to go back home unless the parents personally explain the reason for the delay or send a proper note.
5. Leave application must be sent to the school when a student takes leave. In case it is not convenient to send it before leave is taken, the same must be produced when the student attends school again. In case of sickness, a Medical Certificate must be sent on the following day. Any note/application must be written by the parents either in the diary or on a sheet and sent in an envelope to school. **A student absent for more than five consecutive days without prior information will be considered as withdrawn from the school.** He will consequently be re-admitted only on payment of a fine for the period of his/her absence plus re-admission fees, provided the vacancy has not, in the meantime, been filled in by another pupil.

RULES RELATED TO UNIT TESTS AND EXAMINATIONS :

1. Students must have a minimum of 75% attendance during the academic year in order to qualify for appearance in the Annual Examination.
2. Ailing students will not be allowed to appear for a test/examination. Parents must not send them to school. They must submit a medical certificate within a day so that the final result of the student is not affected.
3. Promotion to the next class will be on the basis of assessment of assignments, class tests, term examinations, classwork and homework. Students absenting themselves from any test or examination will not be re-examined.
4. All the Unit Tests and Examination report cards must be signed by the parents.
5. Students should return their report cards duly signed by their guardians within two days of receipt.
6. The school reserves the right to suspend a student whose diligence or progress in academics is constantly unsatisfactory.
7. Students using unfair means during tests are liable to be expelled from the school.

FEE RULES

1. Parents are requested to go through the fee detail on the Booklet carefully and fill in details at four places accordingly before making the payments at the Bank/School. Under no circumstances are any details to be missed out.
2. All fees are payable on a quarterly basis in advance within the first FIVE working days of the payable month.
3. Payment by Cash only will be made at the Corporation Bank on the first FIVE working days of the payable month of the quarter. However, payment by Cheque will be deposited at the school only on the first FIVE working days of the payable month. Cheque will be made in the name of "Summer Fields School", DLF City, Phase-I Only Delhi / Gurgaon cheques will be accepted. Teacher's copy of the fee booklet, after payment of the fee in cash at the Bank/Cheque at School is to be handed over to the respective class teachers.
4. For all dishonoured cheques returned by the bank for the non-payment, fine will be charged at the rate of Rs. 5/- per day and Rs. 100/- will be charged in addition for every dishonoured cheque. All dues will be deposited in school account in cash only.
5. Parents will keep this Booklet with them and produce it for verification whenever needed by the school.

6. After the 5 working days, parents are to come to the school and ascertain the charges due, with a fine and get it signed by the accountant. Cash will be deposited in the bank.
7. If transport facilities are to be availed of, the parents will be charged for eleven months in an academic session.
8. In case of withdrawal from school as well as from transport, one complete month notice is essential so that the vacancies thus caused may be allotted to students in the waiting list.
9. If fees are not paid on time, it can be deposited with late fee.
10. If fee is not paid till the last day of the month in which the fee was due, name of the child will be struck off the rolls. Intimation to this effect will be sent to the parents from the school. If desired by the parents, admission will be granted to the child subject to availability of seats in that class. Re-admission charges of Rs. 500/- as applicable will have to be deposited along with the fee.

SCHOOL TRANSPORT

The school provides transport facility to its students. Seats will be allotted as and when available. Transport fee is payable in advance by the 10th day of the quarter to which the bill relates, after which a fine will be charged at the rate mentioned in the fee booklet. If the transport charges are still not paid, the transport facility may be stopped for the student and the name of the defaulter will be struck off the transport rolls. He/She will be given a transport seat again only on payment of all the dues along with the fine.

Children will be picked up from convenient stops decided by the school and dropped back. The school will have no responsibility in case of any accident or injury to the children beyond the control of the authorities.

Bus Rules

1. All students using the school bus are expected to be at their stops at least five minutes before the arrival time of the bus.
2. The children should stay away from the main road until the bus arrives.
3. No student should approach the entry door of the bus until the bus comes to a complete halt.
4. All students must occupy vacant seats immediately after boarding.
5. The front door of the bus is the only authorised entrance and exit.
6. The drivers are authorised to stop buses at the designated stops only, unless otherwise directed by the bus teacher. The list of stops is prepared keeping in view the convenience and safety of all bus commuters and is subject to change.
7. When the bus is in motion, students must not move around in the bus and no part of their bodies should be outside the bus.
8. Objects of any kind must not be discarded inside or thrown out of the bus.

9. The bus teacher and student bus monitors are responsible for maintaining discipline in the bus. Any serious offence must be reported to the Principal.
10. No student is allowed to eat in the bus.
11. Students will be held responsible for any damage to the bus caused by negligence or vandalism.
12. Unruly behaviour like shrieking and shouting is strictly prohibited. Courteous behaviour is expected at all times. Strict disciplinary action will be taken against any kind of misconduct.
13. The driver must not be distracted for any reason.
14. Any kind of misconduct by the driver or rash driving must be reported to the school authorities.
15. In case a student does not require use of the bus on a particular day and is required to go by another means of transport, he/she must get a written application from Parents/ Guardian specifying the same.

THE SCHOOL LIBRARY

The school has well - equipped libraries for the Junior as well as the Senior Wings. The students have been provided with a library period in their time-table, so that the habit of extra reading is inculcated.

Rules to be observed :

1. Students must proceed towards the library in a disciplined manner during the allotted period.
2. Students are permitted to carry with them paper, pencil or pen and the library books which they are to return.
3. Students are expected to maintain complete silence in the library.
4. Students are allowed to take books from the shelves. They must put these back after reading, to maintain the order of the library.
5. Each student is issued one library card at the beginning of the academic session. If the card is lost, a duplicate one will be issued only on payment of Rs. 25/-.
6. Students may get one book issued for a period of one week. Books must be returned on or before the due date stamped on the issue card.
7. Failure to return the book on time will result in the levy of a fine of Rs. 1/- per day for the first 7 days and Rs. 2/- per day thereafter.
8. In case of damage to or loss of a book, the student must pay the prevailing price of the book, with an additional amount of Rs. 20/-
9. At the end of the academic session, students must return the library card to the librarian. Loss of the card will result in a fine of Rs. 50/-.
10. Library books, magazines and furniture are to be treated with care. These must not be taken out of the library without permission.

ACADEMICS

SOCIALLY USEFUL PRODUCTIVE WORK

All students of Classes VII and VIII are exposed to various activities which come under SUPW. The purpose of this exposure is to help them hone their finer talents in various fields, give them hands-on experience and to enable them to understand the concept of 'dignity of labour'. The activities which fall under SUPW are Art, Craft, Music, Dance and Home-Science.

WORK EXPERIENCE

Work experience has been termed as 'Work Education' which occupies an important place in the Scheme of Studies for Classes IX to XII. Its programmes are well-structured and graded.

The objectives of Work Education are:

To help the students develop essential knowledge and understanding.

To guide the students in developing useful and constructive skills.

To develop in the students proper attitudes and values.

To provide opportunities to students for participating in various social and economic activities inside and outside the class-rooms.

The course is divided into:

- (a) Essential Activities which enable the child to make appropriate use of his/her environment.
- (b) Elective Activities which include Projects related to Health, Environment, Literacy and the like.

A student is graded on the above activities at the end of the session.

THE THIRD LANGUAGE

It is expected that all students study three languages upto Class VIII. These are:

- (a) English
- (b) Hindi
- (c) Sanskrit / French

Those students who do not clear the third language in Class VIII and are promoted to Class IX are examined by the school at the end of Class IX in the same syllabus and text books as are prescribed for Class VIII. Those who are still unable to clear the third language at the

end of Class IX are given another opportunity in Class X. No student is eligible to appear in the Secondary School Examination of the Board at the end of Class X unless he/she has cleared the third language.

- d) meet the class teacher, subject teacher or Principal with prior appointment before the school begins or as and when necessary.
- e) write to the school regarding any problem faced by the child.
